"I was electrocuted by over 4,000 volts of electricity from a farm accident in September 2019. Unconcious, I could see my wife and kids as if I was dreaming. I woke up when a bystander dragged me away from harm. I was given a second chance at life.

After the accident, I began to examine my life and ask myself, 'why?' Why was I saved? Looking back on my life, I realized that many moments could have turned me into a completely different person. Whether it was when my mother ran off with her old friends, abandoning her rarely-home,

workaholic husband with two young children, being molested at the age of five, rolling my truck eight times when I was 16, or this farm accident, God wasn't done with me then, and He's not done with me now.

My wife and I felt at home from the very first sermon at Crosstown. Every week, my faith was becoming recharged. That small, weak flame of faith that I had since I was a young boy was now becoming an eternal flame that was incapable of extinguishing.

"For as long as I remember, I believed in God. Growing up, I didn't live a religious life. I never prayed or worshiped, but I always knew God existed.




