Global Connect Trip: Intro

Hello Church family and friends,

The following report gives a summary of our Global Connect Trip to Spain this past March (2023).

The primary goal of this trip was to see firsthand the worldwide work of God through our Alliance family. The second aim was to establish connections and friendships with other pastors and/or missionaries in Spain. The more relationally connected we are, the stronger the partnership will be with our missionaries.

With that said, from the moment we landed in Spain our team was on the go! To say we hit the ground running is no overstatement. We were able to see many sites and visit many international workers. We learned that God is doing a significant work in Spain.

We arrived in Madrid safely at 10:15am (local time) and were met by Walter Hopkins (Director of LIFE International School) and Timothy Westergren (Spain Field Director). From there we visited historical sites with spiritual significance that helped us gain a better understanding of the culture:

Museo Archaeological Museum (Pictured to the right) - Our visit to the museum was very helpful for understanding the different people groups who inhabited modern day Spain. The galleries showed a chronological history of Spain.

Following the museum we went to an Islamic Cultural Center where we saw a Muslim prayer room.

Later that evening we had dinner at Walter and Laura Hopkins' home and heard more about their ministry in Spain.

Later that afternoon our team met up with two international workers who are reaching Muslim immigrants. Their ministry offers several types of classes to engage Muslim women and children.

Please pray for *open doors* for these workers to share the Gospel.






Erin and I had our first Churo for breakfast! The Churos were served with a side of thick hot chocolate! Not the healthiest of options but very delicious!

03 Daily Travel Log: Headed South




On the way to Malaga, Spain (appx. 5hr 30 min. drive) we stopped to see a breathtaking overlook of the city of Toledo.

He and Asun have given the last 15 years of their life serving migrants and refugees. As Asun so eloquently said during our time together, “these boys may lose their jobs, but they cannot lose the hope that comes as we share the Gospel with them.”

Sharon has a master's in violin performance and is a licensed physical therapist assistant. Her favorite job however is getting to know people, and helping them get to know Jesus.






Lunch along the Mediterranean right near where the Nicholases serve. Erin and I tried our first Octopus!

On Wednesday morning, our team traveled to Project Bethany House in El Campello, Alicante (appx. 3hr 50min drive). Bethany House is a school designed to raise up the next generation of church leaders. The school uses a curriculum from salt leadership.

In August 2015, Life and Family Church launched a summer school and longer-term resident training program for youth in Europe called Bethany School.

The goal of the school is to help youth know who they are in Christ, hear His call on their lives, and serve Him more effectively in the local church and beyond.

Students live on-site for 3 months and are taught the Bible. Pray for this much-needed ministry that God would continue to multiply leaders and churches.

On Wednesday afternoon, we had the opportunity to tour the Campello Christian Community Church. The church is located in a very strategic part of town. We were given a tour of the facility.


It was at this location, Patty shared the church's vision...






After lunch, we walked around the town of Cuenca. Cuenca is known for their “hanging houses”


